Jeffrey A. Cooper is a Professor of Law and Associate Dean for Research and Faculty Development at Quinnipiac University School of Law, where he teaches coursework related to estate planning, wills and trusts, and related areas of taxation. He has been a Visiting Professor at the University of Connecticut School of Law and a Visiting Lecturer at Yale Law School. He currently also serves as a Special Counsel to the law firm of Shipman & Goodwin.

Professor Cooper received his A.B. in Government, *magna cum laude*, from Harvard College, his J.D. from Yale Law School and an LL.M. in Taxation from New York University School of Law. He is completing work toward his PhD in law at Leiden University. He is an Academic Fellow of the American College of Trust and Estate Counsel (ACTEC) and has been named as one of Quinnipiac University's Faculty Scholars.

A frequent lecturer, Professor Cooper has authored numerous articles on various topics relating to estate planning, probate and taxation. His articles have been published in Law Journals across the country, excerpted in prominent casebooks and treatises, and reprinted both in the U.S. and abroad. In 2021, he published his debut novel, *After the Fact*, a legal thriller set in a major law firm.

In addition to his scholarly achievements, Professor Cooper has extensive practical experience, including over a decade practicing law as a partner of a major law firm and serving as a senior officer of the United States Trust Company. He has been a member of the Connecticut, New York, and Massachusetts bars, and is admitted to practice before the United States Tax Court and the Internal Revenue Service.

Professor Cooper is a resident of Greenwich, CT, where he has served as an elected member of the Representative Town Meeting, a Justice of the Peace and a Director of several non-profits. He is married with three children.
